The **National Sustainable Agriculture Coalition** (NSAC) is currently seeking a Grassroots Intern for the fall, beginning in mid August through December. This position is paid, full time, and is located at NSAC's DC office on Capitol Hill.

NSAC is the leading advocacy organization for federal policy that supports sustainable agriculture and food systems. We work towards the vision of creating a safe, nutritious, and affordable food supply produced by a legion of diverse family farmers who make a decent living pursuing their trade, while sustaining the environment and contributing to the strength of their communities. NSAC's collaborative work environment offers a unique career opportunity to advance federal sustainable agriculture policy through grassroots advocacy as part of a dedicated and effective team.

Position Description

NSAC's Grassroots Intern will work closely with NSAC's grassroots and policy staff on the full range of daily activities in our fast-paced DC office, with a focus on working on several active grassroots advocacy campaigns. The Grassroots Intern will report to NSAC's Grassroots Director.

Tasks will include:

- Developing creative, impactful outreach and engagement tools for farmers and consumers – including digital and multimedia materials – around farm bill programs, the Food Safety Modernization Act, Child Nutrition Reauthorization, and several other policy issues;
- Assisting NSAC staff and coalition members with national grassroots outreach campaigns using social media, email, and other advocacy tools;
- Conducting research and data analysis to support advocacy materials;
- Drafting and editing blog posts, social media posts, advocacy messages, and press pitches;
- Managing incoming calls and other administrative duties with NSAC's Policy Intern; and
- Assisting with other projects and assignments as needed.

- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Experience with community organizing and grassroots capacity building efforts
- Ability to both work independently and be a good team player
- Willingness to work around a demanding congressional schedule and administrative deadlines

- Graphic design experience and knowledge of Adobe CreativeSuite, HTML, and/or Javascript a plus
