Dear Chairman Kohl and Ranking Member Brownback:

We write to express support for the Sustainable Agriculture Research and Education (SARE) program and request that the Subcommittee include \$30 million in the FY 2011 Agriculture Appropriations bill to help launch a new era of research advancing the profitability, productivity, and environmental services of sustainable agriculture.

SARE is a competitive research, education, and extension grant program with a twenty-two year history of ensuring that farmers and ranchers have the tools necessary to meet new economic and environmental challenges in agriculture. Unique in its function and form - SARE is a farmer-driven, regionally-led, and outcome-oriented program which has resulted in new production techniques, higher sales, and greater environmental stewardship.

In recent years, SARE has been funded at less than a third of its original authorized funding level of \$60 million. Year in and year out, SARE is consistently over-subscribed, and the program has only been able to fund between 8% - 10% of the proposals submitted. The U.S. Government Accountability Office, independent evaluators, farmer surveys, and stakeholder reviews all indicate the award-winning nature of this program and its ability to produce real-world outcomes that benefit farmers and communities.

Funding SARE at \$30 million will finally jumpstart the federal-state matching grant program and will support President Obama's FY 2011 budget request, with a specific designation of \$10 million for the matching grants program. By funding the matching grants program as envisioned by Congress, we will increase the capacity and long-term commitment of our states sustainable agriculture centers and institutes to develop innovative agriculture programs to address high-priority agricultural problems.
