Dear Speaker Pelosi:

We the undersigned organizations support speedy passage of the *Improving Nutrition for America's Children Act* (H.R. 5504). We understand the critical need to provide additional funding and improved policy for school meal programs. We trust that appropriate offsets can be found quickly to get this bill to the President's desk before the current authorization expires at the end of September.

We are also united, however, in fervently opposing any attempt to use farm bill conservation program funding for this purpose. We oppose the \$2.8 billion cut to the Environmental Quality Incentives Program contained in the companion Senate bill reported out of committee, and we would also just as strongly oppose any proposed cut to any other farm bill conservation program.

Farmers, ranchers, and forest landowners are eager to share the cost of protecting the environment, and indeed demand for participation in conservation programs routinely far outstrips available funding. Applied conservation helps provide clean air and water, energy conservation, erosion reduction, carbon sequestration, wildlife and pollinator habitat, wetland protection, pesticide reduction, and other important public benefits that should not be lost.

After long and careful negotiation, the 2008 Farm Bill moved in the right direction by increasing resources for these purposes, and was widely touted for doing so. Now is not the time to reverse course and sacrifice an improved environment for improved nutrition. This is a false choice, one that is neither in the public interest nor in keeping with progressive values.

We support passage of child nutrition reauthorization, but we oppose using conservation funding to pay for it. We look forward to working with you and with Chairman Miller and others to find progressive alternatives to get the job done and the child nutrition bill to the President's desk.
