Dear Senator,

The undersigned organizations, representing millions of members across the country concerned about the future of grasslands, urge the Agriculture Committees and the Joint Select Committee on Deficit Reduction to recognize the importance of grasslands to our economy, wildlife, and the American way of life as you recommend changes to farm bill programs as part of any deficit reduction plan.

Grasslands are of vital importance for raising livestock, supporting a robust hunting and recreation industry, and providing habitat for dwindling wildlife species - including grassland birds, some of which are exhibiting the fastest population declines in the country. Yet grasslands are rapidly shrinking, and with them, the ranching industry that depends on grassland for survival. The undersigned organizations have unified around the following farm bill priorities which we believe are critical for the health and survival of America's grasslands:

- 1) Re-establish soil and wetland conservation compliance provisions for crop insurance subsidies;
- 2) Adopt a strong national sodsaver provision to end existing public incentives for converting native grassland to cropland;
- 3) Ensure a strong grasslands component within working lands conservation programs; and
- 4) Maintain funding for easements on native grasslands

As our nation faces one of the most difficult fiscal climates in history, measures that benefit natural resources and save tax dollars—such as sodsaver and re-linking compliance to crop insurance—are critically important. In addition, grasslands provide vital services such as flood mitigation, water filtration, and carbon sequestration. Investing in grasslands through easements and working lands conservation programs will benefit all Americans.

As you work to find cost-saving measures within the farm bill, we ask you to please stand up for grasslands and the American ranchers, rural communities, outdoor enthusiasts, and sportsmen and women who depend upon and benefit from them.
