Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Evaluating how emerging policies affect the food system for individuals, businesses and government agencies
- Monitoring events, policy decisions and trends and other issues with implications for the political and policy landscape
- Forecasting political, economic, and social trends related to food
- Assuring that web content is continuously refreshed and up to date
- Contributing to weekly team editorial meetings
- Researching and writing blog posts; editing and proofreading
- Providing analysis and developing positions on food and agriculture issues including animal agriculture, city/state and federal food policies, organic agriculture, aquaculture and food labeling
- Providing analysis of academic and policy research and analyzing statistical data
