Dear Chairs and Ranking Members:

The undersigned organizations respectfully request a FY10 appropriation for SARE of \$30 million, with \$25 million allocated to research and education and \$5 million to extension and professional development.

The Sustainable Agriculture Research and Education program (SARE) program is an exceptionally successful competitive grants program that funds farmer-driven research, education, and extension initiatives. SARE projects have a long and distinguished track record of furthering farm profitability, on-farm economic innovation and environmentally and socially sound farming practices. Its unique regional approach to grant making has achieved an overall and unparalleled level of national equity in the delivery of its services.

SARE builds economic prosperity, innovation and opportunity. Its research and education grants help first-time farmers get started and succeed. Its research portfolio is a treasure trove of information to help farmers find ways to be more profitable, to conserve resources and to contribute to their communities. The research and education support that SARE has provided to farmers has literally transformed lifestyles, livelihoods and communities, not just production and marketing systems.

Despite SARE's many successes the program has never been adequately funded. Demand for SARE funds is big and growing but in most years it has been able to fund less than 10% of the meritorious research and education proposals submitted.

SARE is authorized to be funded at \$40 million for its research and education program and \$20 million for its extension education and professional development program. Actual combined funding for both programs, however, has never topped \$19 million.

In addition to enhancing the existing program components, including farmer grants, the increase would also enable SARE to launch two new and important program initiatives. At this level, research and education funding would finally be sufficient to allow SARE to initiate its state matching grants program. This authorized but never before funded program would allow SARE to use its authority to fund state and local programs to further sustainable food and agriculture programs and research projects. These partnerships would leverage private, state and local monies in support of sustainable agriculture and build state and local capacity for research and education.

SARE is also ready to commence a new set of agricultural systems projects to help investigate and develop climate-friendly farming system innovations. This critical new funding area also requires a funding increase to get started.

Increased funding will allow SARE to reach significantly more farmers, support projects designed to spur economic growth in rural communities, enhance farmer-to-consumer marketing opportunities, and help bridge the gap in training and research for sustainable and organic farming systems. We respectfully urge you to include \$30 million for SARE in the FY 2010 agricultural appropriations bill
