Dear Chairman Heinrich, Ranking Member Hoeven, Chairman Harris, Ranking Member Bishop:

As you work in the coming weeks and months to enact a Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Bill, the undersigned 140 organizations and farm businesses strongly urge you to include funding for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Office of Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production in any final FY2024 appropriations legislation.

Recently, more than 50 Congressional leaders in the <u>Senate</u> and <u>House</u> - along with over <u>70</u> <u>stakeholder organizations</u> from around the country - called for full funding for OUAIP. Despite these calls, both the House and Senate Agriculture Appropriations Subcommittees failed to include funding for OUAIP in their respective FY2024 proposals. This lack of funding threatens to slow the progress of the Office that has continuously grown in popularity to the extent that demand is far outpacing available funding: only an average of 20 percent of eligible OUAIP grant requests are funded.

The Office of Urban Agriculture & Innovative Production (OUAIP), first established in the bipartisan Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018, provides support to urban farmers creating or expanding their businesses, encourages and promotes controlled environment agriculture and other emerging practices, promotes municipal food waste reduction strategies, and fosters community food security through networks of growers, partners, and community members.

Since OUAIP received its first appropriation in 2020, it has quickly responded to nationwide interest by investing over \$57 million in 184 grants and 82 cooperative agreements to increase the capacity of urban agriculture, innovative producers, and municipal composting initiatives in local communities across 43 states and Puerto Rico. In order to improve outreach to growers and meet growing demand for USDA production and conservation services in urban areas, OUAIP has established Farm Service Agency urban county office committees and USDA service centers

across the country - in Arizona, Georgia, Louisiana, Minnesota, Missouri, New Mexico, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia, Illinois, New York, Michigan, and California. OUAIP coordinates with NRCS and FSA to identify and eliminate barriers for urban and innovative producers while disseminating best practices.

Urban farming has grown more than 30 percent in the U.S. in the last thirty years. To ensure the needs of urban, indoor, and innovative producers are addressed broadly across USDA, OUAIP is working on structural, process, and culture change through service offerings and intra-agency coordination. Their work will help employees at all levels of the USDA to support agriculture regardless of the size of the operations, where it is located, or how the products are produced.

Urban and controlled environment agriculture continue to be a growing sector of the U.S. agricultural economy and – with full funding and support for OUAIP – has the potential to influence our food and farming systems in a way that invests in a diverse range of growing techniques that promote healthy communities, urban and rural economies, and resilient climates. OUAIP supports growing more food in community gardens, greenhouses, indoor vertical farms, and on rooftops and creates greater access to healthy foods through year round growing and a variety of market types such as local farm stands, mobile markets, and food pantries. Many of these urban farms are operated by and for people of color, unlike the broader farming sector, and increase access to farming opportunities for new, beginning, and underserved farmers.

The Office of Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production has demonstrated significant success to date through implementation of direct program offerings and technical coordination across agencies. We strongly encourage you to sustain the growth of the Office and its activities by including FY2024 funding that is at least commensurate with the FY2023 enacted level of \$8.5 million.
